1. About colours... Exploring the palette beyond black

Black is a choice often made too quickly; use the different options and endless possibilities to put your own unique stamp on a design. 2. Powder coatings

Most of Alinel's profiles get their colour by means of powder coating. The colour catalogue is vast, and all our coatings meet all the requirements of the Qualicoat label. Powder coating involves applying a fine dry coating material to the profiles. The powder is electrostatically charged, making it adhere to the aluminium. The profiles are then placed in an oven, where the powder melts and cures into a uniform, Qualicoat-approved coating.

3. What colour should I choose for my cladding?

The colour of your cladding is a vital decision you make for your design. It is important that the colour you use matches the colour choice of the joinery. The colour of your cladding and joinery helps determine the ambiance you want to create in your building project. The choice of colour can add character to your design, but it should be colour-coordinated with the other elements of the facade.













1. Neutral tones

Light and neutral colours are very versatile, which also explains their popularity: they go well with different architectural styles. Neutral colours also create an open feeling and reflect light, bringing a bright and summery atmosphere to the building project. Especially when contrasted with darker colours in your building project, will light colours make the best impression. Be careful with pure white, on a facade facing the sun that colour can cause a blinding effect. If your cladding is to become part of a sun-facing facade, choose a light grey, beige or cream-white colour.




1. The Natural Look
